NEW YORK, December 12, 2024 – El Museo del Barrio is delighted to announce the 47th Annual Three Kings Day Parade and Celebration to be held on **Monday, January 6, 2025** in East Harlem (El Barrio). *The Arts Open Paths: Celebrating the Transformative Power of the Arts* (Abriendo Caminos, Celebrando el Poder Transformativo de las Artes) celebrates the power of Latinx, Caribbean, and Latin American art to connect cultures and uplift communities. The Celebration will honor those individuals who made significant contributions to the Latinx community. The Parade will kick off at 106th Street and Park Avenue, winding its way through the streets of El Barrio to culminate at 115th Street and Park Avenue. Spectators can expect a spectacular display of live music, colorful costumes, camels, floats, and the participation of thousands of students and community members. Notable performers include **Annette Aguilar & Stringbeans**, **BombaYo!**, **Fogo Azul Bateria Femenina**, **Aurora & Zon del Barrio**, and many more. This year's Three Kings Day Celebration poster was created by Bronx-native artist, Krystal Quiles.
